Academic Life at Bishop Dwenger is designed to inspire a lifetime of learning. Our curriculum is challenging. Our teaching staff is well-educated: BD faculty averages 14 years' teaching experience and 44% have earned Master's Degrees. The student/teacher ratio is 15:1. We reward academic excellence. Qualifying students receive a letter and jacket – many the semesters before junior year. One of three diplomas can be earned: Core 40, Core 40 Academic Honors, Core 40, or Technical Honors. Bishop Dwenger is in the 95th percentile in the state for percent graduating with honors diploma. 96% of our graduates attend post-secondary schools.
